Purpose: This document provides you with key information about this investment product. It is not marketing material. The information is required by law to help you understand the nature, risks, costs, potential gains and losses of this product and to help you compare it with other products.

You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand

What is this product?

Type: Structured Note.

Term: The product has a fixed term and will be due on 22 July 2027.

Objectives: This product is designed to provide the investor with (1) a return in the form of quarterly variable interest amounts paid on Interest Payment Dates and calculated by reference to the relative daily level of 3 month Euribor, and (2) a cash payment of the Product

Notional amount on the Maturity. The product has a fixed term and will terminate on the Maturity Date.

Interest amounts: on each Interest Payment Date you will receive an interest payment of EUR: Product Notional amount * Interest Rate per annum.

Interest Rate: the Interest Rate in respect of each Product Notional Amount and an Interest Period is the percentage determined by the formula:

4.50% x Range Accrual

Range Accrual: a fraction calculated by Eurobank S.A., by reference to the formula: (Days Accrued) / (Actual Days). Actual Days: the actual number of calendar days in such Interest Period.

<u>Days Accrued</u>: the number of calendar days in such Interest Period for which the Underlying is greater or equal to 2.25% and less or equal than 3.75%.

Rate Determination Date: in respect of a calendar day in an Interest Period and the Relevant Rate, the day which is 5 Target Business Days immediately preceding such calendar day. If the Relevant Screen Page is not available and/or the Relevant Rate does not appear, the relevant Rate Determination Date will instead be the immediately preceding Target Business Day for which the Relevant Screen Page was available and such Relevant Rate appeared on the Relevant Screen Page.

Interest Payment Dates or Interest Period: 22nd of October, 22nd of January, 22nd of April and 22nd of July of each year, from and including 22nd of October 2024 to and including the Maturity Date.

Underlying: 3 month Euribor: Euro Interbank Offered Rate (the benchmark rate of Euro money markets) with designated maturity 3 months.

Relevant Screen page: Reuters Screen page EURIBOR01. The 3-month Euribor rate is published by the official website of the European Money Markets Institute (EMMI). Eurobank, in case of a significant change or interruption of the provision of the Reference Index, will take the actions described in the Action Plan document (https://www.eurobank.gr/-/media/eurobank/footer/pdf/plan-alternative-benchmarks-eurobank-global-markets-en.pdf) prepared in compliance with Article 28 (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/1011 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 8th June 2016 on indices used as benchmarks in financial instruments and financial contracts or to measure the performance of investment funds.

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the product issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the underlying index, the product and the product issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

Intended retail investor:

The product is intended to be offered to retail investors who fulfil all of the criteria below:

What are the risks and what could I get in return?



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until the Maturity Date. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to end your product early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to end your product early.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 5 out of 7, which is a medium-high risk class. You are entitled to receive back at least 100.00% of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash-in before the Maturity date. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. However, you may benefit from a consumer protection scheme (see section "What happens if the Bank is unable to pay out?"). The indicator shown above does not consider this protection. The favourable, moderate and unfavourable scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the reference asset's performance over up to 5 past years. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period you do not have a guarantee and you may have to pay extra costs

What happens if the Bank is unable to pay out?

You are exposed to the risk that the Bank, as issuer, might be unable to meet its obligations in connection with the product, for instance in the event of bankruptcy or an official directive for resolution action. What are the costs?

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you hold the product and how well the product does. We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the product performs as shown in the moderate scenario.

How long should I hold it and can I take my money out early?

Recommended Holding Period: 3 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until maturity.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product, either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. By selling the product before its maturity, you may receive back less than you would have received if you had kept the product until maturity.
